### CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Katz called the meeting to order at 7pm, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. **March 10, 2026**

#### **Resolution #160-26**

Trustee Schwartz made a motion to approve the March 10, 2026, minutes, seconded by Trustee Mause. Upon vote, Yea: Mayor Katz, Trustee Schwartz and Trustee Mause. This motion carried unanimously.

### PUBLIC HEARING

2. **2026-2027 Village Budget**

Mayor Katz confirmed with the Village Clerk that the public hearing was properly noticed in the newspaper and posted.

Trustee Mause made a motion to open the public hearing, seconded by Trustee Schwartz. Upon vote, Yea: Mayor Katz, Trustee Schwartz and Trustee Mause. This motion carried unanimously.

Janice Golda, 16 Martha Road was present and requested that the Mayor review the accumulated surplus number as the proposed budget seems to have an error. Mayor Katz agreed that the last page of the budget relating to surplus had errors and would have those corrected which would result in the proper number being shown for accumulated surplus.

Janice Golda questioned why there is not a tax reduction proposed in the budget since the Village has a large surplus. Mayor Katz answered that the Village is proposing a 1.06 % reduction. Mayor Katz added that the Village does have a large surplus as we have been planning all the sidewalk projects. The Village needs funds on hand as we have to lay out 100% of the cost of each invoice the projects and wait while the State processes reimbursements.

Janice Golda noted that administrative costs have been increased over the past few years. How does the Village plan on handling the staff if there is a lull in activity? Mayor Katz answered that the Village has seen an increase in rateables in the Village. While there is not much land left to build on in the Village, the reconstruction of and additions to existing homes have been increasing our rateables. We currently have over 300 open permits at the current time, which is why we added a new full-time staff member in the budget. Ms. Golda questioned if the Village has to downsize, what will happen to staff? Mayor Katz answered that the Board will make a decision at that time.

Janice Golda questioned what improvements are proposed for the Village Park? Mayor Katz stated that the Village is in need to replace the playground equipment and have allocated \$100,000 in the budget. The Village has requested \$75,000 from Senator Weber. We did not place the proposed grant in the Budget because that commitment has not been confirmed.

Janice Golda questioned if the software upgrades have made the workflow more efficient or less efficient? Mayor Katz has stated that once they are implemented, the software upgrades will make access to our records open to the public. As with all new equipment, it takes time to test it before it is released.

Mayor Katz stated that he has received a request from Judge Schnelwar for an increase in his salary due to the increase in work duties. Board Members are in favor of this increase. Mayor Katz stated line item 8110 would be increased from \$20,000-\$25,000.

Mayor Katz made a motion to close the public hearing, seconded by Trustee Schwartz. Upon vote, Yea: Mayor Katz, Trustee Schwartz and Trustee Mause. This motion carried unanimously.

24. **Authorizing the Agreement with the County of Rockland, Acting on Behalf of the Youth Bureau/Rockland Conservation and Service Corps, for Summer Member Program (Planning Department) – 2026**

**WHEREAS**, the Rockland County Youth Bureau has created a Rockland Conservation and Service Corps which is staffed with members to participate in a service-oriented, educational and environmentally beneficial program and it has proposed to provide Rockland Conservation and Service Corps members under the direction of the Village Engineer to participate in the collection of data for application within the Village of Wesley Hills Geographic Information System (GIS) and work related to the implementation Village of Wesley Hills MS4 Stormwater Program, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village will require assistance in collecting spatial data in the field and processing and applying this data into the GIS, and

**WHEREAS**, the Rockland Conservation and Service Corps members will be collecting information on the Village's stormwater outfalls and other municipal infrastructure for addition to the Village's GIS database, and

**WHEREAS**, this stormwater data will enhance the Village's current Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) program and heighten our ability to track and intercept illicit discharges and fuel spills or other pollutants which may be accidentally discharged to the municipal stormwater system, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village will require assistance in researching and organizing information to aid in the implementation of the Village of Wesley Hills Stormwater Management Plan and its update, and

**WHEREAS**, Rockland Conservation and Service Corps members receive a minimal stipend while participating in the program which would be funded in part by the Village of Wesley Hills, and

**WHEREAS**, the Village Engineer has recommended this program for adoption in the Village of Wesley Hills;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor is hereby authorized to enter into an agreement with the County of Rockland, acting on behalf of the Youth Bureau/Rockland Conservation and Service Corps, for the calendar year ending August 31, 2026, in a form

approved by the Village Attorney, to utilize the service of not more than one (1) Rockland Conservation and Service Corps members to participate in the collection of data for application within the Village of Wesley Hills Geographic Information System (GIS) and work related to the implementation of the Village of Wesley Hills Stormwater Management Plan, for a program total not to exceed 250 service hours for the member at a cost not to exceed \$2,500.

Camille Guido-Downey, Village Clerk Treasurer reported on the following:

Wesley Chapel Bridge

The Village had the required 6 trees removed from the site to speed up the time frame to get O&R onsite to start their utility work. By doing the tree removal and utility work now we are eliminating that work from the bid documents. The State is reviewing the draft documents now.

Willow Tree Road Sidewalk Project

Project Engineer is finalizing the ROW work now. The Village is waiting for NYSDOT to give final approval on the design. Project Engineer expects to go out to bid in 2026 and maybe construct in 2026.

Wilder Road Sidewalk Project

Project Engineer stated that the Village is waiting on NYSDOT for preliminary design approval.

Route 306 Sidewalks

The surveying work is 90% complete and we are waiting on the contract for Stonefield Engineer, who the Village will need to contract with for the design and traffic light changes.

Village Paving

The following streets will be paved in 2026, Grand Park, Fieldcrest, Shul and Carter Lane. Paving is expected to start in June.

**OPEN FLOOR: PUBLIC DISCUSSION**

Max Jacobs, 220 Willow Tree Road requested the Village Board to not re-install the speed humps on Willow Tree Road. Mr. Jacobs stated that the humps are not reducing the speeding on the street. The humps are extremely noisy. Mayor Katz took a poll of the Board Members if the speed humps should be removed:

Trustee Schwartz - agreed

Trustee Mause - agreed

Trustee Cherns - disagreed

Mayor Katz - agreed

Board Members agree that the speed humps at this location should not be re-installed as they have not been productive in mitigating speeding and requested the Village Clerk-Treasurer to notify the Town of Ramapo to not install the speed humps.

Max Jacobs requested the Mayor and Village Board to speak with Ramapo Police Department on the enforcement of no truck traffic on Willow Tree Road. Mayor Katz stated that he will reach out to the Police Department.

Lastly, Max Jacobs requested that the Village review our code in reference to lawn signs as he understands that they are not allowed, but they are all over the Village. Enforcement and fines need to be reviewed and amended. Howard Richman stated that he is aware and has had conversations with the Code Officer about changes to the law.

**LOCAL LAW NO. \_\_\_ of 2026**

**VETERANS TAX EXEMPTION - 100% SERVICE CONNECTED DISABILITY**

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Wesley Hills, County of Rockland, State of New York, as follows:

Section I. Chapter 200, titled Taxation, of the Code of the Village of Wesley Hills is amended by adding a new Article designated as Article IX and titled Veterans Tax Exemption — 100% Service Connected Disability, to read as follows:

§200-60. Legislative intent. State Real Property Tax Law §458-a authorizes a municipality to adopt a local law to include the primary residence of any seriously disabled veteran. The intent of this local law is to allow such property tax exemption upon application made by a seriously disabled veteran in accordance with Real Property Tax Law §458-a.

§200-61. Qualification for Exemption. The primary residence of any seriously disabled veteran who:

- (a)(i) was discharged or released therefrom under honorable conditions;
  - (ii) has a qualifying condition, as defined in section one of the veterans services law, and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service; or
  - (iii) is a discharged LGBT veteran, as defined in section one of the veteran's service law and has received a discharge other than bad conduct or dishonorable from such service; and
- (b)(i) is considered to be permanently and totally disabled as a result of military service;
  - (ii) is rated 100% disabled by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs;
  - (iii) has been rated by the United States Department of Veterans' Affairs as individually unemployable; and
  - (iv) who is eligible for pecuniary assistance from the United States government, or has received pecuniary assistance from the United States government and has applied such assistance toward the acquisition or modification of a suitable housing unit with

special features or movable facilities made necessary by the nature of the veterans disability and the necessary law therefor shall be fully exempt from taxation and special district charges, assessments and special ad valorem levies, provided that such veteran meets all other requirements of this section.

Section 2. This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.
